

ABOUT KAEJA d'DANCE



Since 1991, Kaeja d'Dance has created award-winning contemporary dance performances, site-specific works with large numbers of dancers, acclaimed dance films, educational outreach programs and community inclusive projects. They break ground, instigate risk and bring together dancers and collaborators to create experiences both on and off the stage,

in local and international communities. On faculty at the School of the Toronto Dance Theatre and Ryerson University, they were the first teachers of Contact Dance at the National Ballet School. Their partnering style has toured around the world, as well as played a vital role in the creation of their 19 dance on screen films for BRAVO! and CBC. Karen and Allen have been commissioned by companies in India, Mexico, Sweden, Portugal, Norway, England, the US and across Canada. A fiery and complimentary duo, Karen and Allen bring their expertise to a peak in their dances. With over 140 original works, their signature aesthetic is known for its athletic intensity, sensual articulation and theatrical imagery, carving distinctly individual sensibilities by each of the Directors at the heart of the art.

Kaeja d'Dance has been involved with community-based projects since 1989. Karen & Allen were first introduced to working with in need communities while on tour in Venezuela where they worked in the Barrio's surrounding Caracas with street youth. In 1998, they were invited to Sweden to work on a major initiative with local youth, pre-professional and professional dancers to be presented together in Sweden that then toured both the region and the country. The positive impact that these endeavors had, inspired the development of their intensive teaching programs. Over the past twenty years Karen & Allen have worked worldwide with approximately 20,000 non-professional, pre and post professional youth as well as local community members. Community projects have also included Karen's BIRD'S EYE VIEW and Stable Dances for Toronto's Nuit Blanche at the Casa Loma Stables and the Guelph Contemporary Dance Festival, and Allen's Just Dance: JF.

ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES



PETER CHIN is a Jamaican-born, Toronto-based choreographer/dancer, composer/musician, designer, and artistic director of the interdisciplinary company Tribal Crackling Wind. His works have been presented across Canada, as well as in Japan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Cambodia, India, Singapore, Holland, the UK, Jamaica, Mexico, Colombia and the US. Numerous awards include four Dora Awards in dance, the Muriel Sherrin Award for international achievement in dance, and a Gemini Award for "Best Performance in a performing arts program". LAUREN COOK is a dancer, teacher, choreographer and the Artistic Director of Alias Dance Project. Cook's work has been presented in festivals, performance series and productions. Cook was nominated and awarded emerging artist of the year, at the Soul Pepper Dance awards. Her collaboration with filmmaker Dean Vargas, 'Restorative Structure', was presented as a part of SPRUNG. Cook is working with choreographer Troy Feldman on work that will be presented in Alias' next full production. (www.aliasdanceproject.com)



SHARON DIGENOVA began her career in a Broadway touring house in Massachusetts. She has since worked in numerous capacities in numerous disciplines – touring to 300+ cities in 30+ countries. She has collaborated with scores of artists and companies including The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, Desrosier Dance Theatre, Ronnie Burkett Theatre of Marionettes, Circus Orange and from 1997-07 was resident Technical Director, Production Stage Manager and Designer for Canada's Holy Body Tattoo. Sharon is a full-time animal rights activist, launching Holly's Hope, producing events to raise money for animals in need.



ALLEN KAEJA is an internationally recognized, award winning choreographer and filmmaker. He's created over 120 stage works, written two books and directed/ choreographed for 26 films. Allen is Co-Artistic Director of Kaeja d'Dance with his wife Karen and co-founder of the CanAsian Dance Festival and fFIDA. He teaches master workshops in Kaeja Elevations worldwide and his works have been presented in festivals around the globe. Over the years, Allen has received dozens of national and international commissions, including Norway, Sweden, UK, India, USA, and Mexico. Allen was the International Guest Choreographer and judge for Mexico's Canal22: OperaPrima and just completed being local mentor and performer for HipHop's Open Art Surgery with internationally renowned JonziD.



Celebrating 25 years as Co-Artistic Director of Kaeja d'Dance with Allen, KAREN KAEJA has been commissioned and presented by festivals worldwide as a performer, choreographer, educator and film artist. Her awards span the CDA I Love Dance Community Award, the Moving Pictures Award, the Paul D. Fleck and finalist for NOW Magazine Best Local Choreographer. Nominations include an Outstanding Performance Dora, American Choreography and Banff World Television Awards, 2013 finalist for TD Diversity Award, as well as finalist for the 2012 I Love Dance Innovation Award. A 2012 guest artist for the Guelph Contemporary Dance Festival, she will be the first dancer in residence at Memorial University/Dance Newfoundland this fall. Included in The Canadian, Who's Who and Theatre Dance in Canada Encyclopedia's, Karen has a critically acclaimed body of stage and community inclusive performances.



LOUIS LABERGE-CÔTÉ is a Toronto-based dancer, choreographer, teacher, and rehearsal director. An acclaimed performer, he has danced nationally and internationally with over 20 companies, including Toronto Dance Theatre (1999-2007) and the Kevin O'Day Ballett Nationaltheater Mannheim (2009-2011). He has created over 60 choreographic works, which have been presented and commissioned in Canada and abroad. His work has garnered him 6 Dora Mavor Moore Award nominations for Outstanding Performance and Choreography, and just this year was the recepient of a Dora for Outstanding Choreography.



BRANDY LEARY's work has been produced in Canada, Europe, India, South Africa and in the USA. She has lived between Canada and India for the past 15 years training, collaborating and creating. She was the resident choreographer at the Bata Shoe Museum in 2010-2012, is a triple Shastri Indo Canadian Fellow, a Chalmers Professional Development Awardee, twice shortlisted for the KM Hunter Award in Dance. Brandy founded Anandam Dancetheatre as an umbrella structure for her projects. (www.anandam.ca)
